Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day

October 6, 2017

WHEREAS, New Jersey is in the midst of a life-threatening opioid abuse epidemic; and

WHEREAS, the Partnership for a Drug-Free New Jersey has designated October 6, 2017 as Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day – an initiative with a dual purpose: to educate families of the addictive qualities of opioid pain medicines and their link to heroin abuse rates in New Jersey, and communicate to physicians information on safer prescribing messages found in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines for prescribing opiates, which include considering other therapies, setting realistic treatment goals with patients and discussing with patients the pros and cons of opioids; and

WHEREAS, the State Senate and General Assembly jointly resolved that October 6 shall be permanently designated as "Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day" in New Jersey in order to raise awareness about the dangers of, and the link between, opioid abuse and heroin addiction and to educate health care providers, community leaders, State lawmakers and members of the public about the opioid abuse epidemic and its effects throughout the State of New Jersey and across the country; and

WHEREAS, Join Together Atlantic County (JTAC) supports initiatives designed to raise awareness about opiate abuse in New Jersey and take steps to prevent addiction

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that October 6, 2017 be recognized as Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day in the Borough of Folsom, New Jersey.

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-88

RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS REGARDING THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT AND OPEN PUBLIC RECORDS ACT

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee took action on Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046, which amend the Open Public Meetings Act and Open Public Records Act, respectively, on June 29, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Committee released the bills to the full Senate without recommendation because the bills are unnecessary, unpopular with the public, and would result in significant financial and administrative burdens on municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the bills fail to adequately protect taxpayers, municipalities and, especially, municipal clerks from abusive, harassing, and purposefully confrontational individuals who submit voluminous requests for no legitimate reason; and

WHEREAS, the legislation would expand the Open Public Meeting Act to create impractical and burdensome requirements with respect to subcommittees and working groups established by the entire governing body, which would effectively limit the ability of small groups of local officials discussing issues of public concern for the purposes of informing the governing body; and

WHEREAS, under the bills, the responsibilities of municipal clerks, who the Legislature has already loaded with responsibilities beyond the scope of their office, would be stretched even further than current law requires without a single dollar of additional resources provided to, or authorized to be collected by, municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the bills would impose a financial burden on municipalities that would not be offset by a revenue source other than the property tax, making the bills unfunded mandates prohibited by the New Jersey Constitution; and

WHEREAS, some municipalities are more equipped than others to meet the burdens that would be imposed by Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046, however, without assistance of any kind from the States or the courts, every municipality would be on its own to meet the myriad new requirements of the law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough

of Folsom, that the Legislature is strongly urged to reject Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 and draft new legislation to modernize OPRA and OPMA while providing municipalities and clerks with the resources to effectuate these changes for the benefit of the public.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be filed with the legislative sponsors of Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 and Assembly Bill Nos. 2697 and 2699, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the President of the Senate, and the Governor, and all parties are urged to listen to the concerns of local officials and prevent Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 from becoming law.

WHEREAS, meetings of the Mayor and Borough Council are subject to the provisions of a Statute entitled the "Open Public Meetings Act" codified within N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, et. seq.;

WHEREAS, the said Act provides for public participation within all meetings, except those meetings or business which involve certain enumerated activities of a public body as further set forth in the said Statute; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to discuss and act upon matters subject to the exclusions of said Act under the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10-4-12, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Act hereinabove recited provides that a public body may exclude public participation within any meeting wherein such matters may be discussed or acted upon provided that a Resolution be adopted at a meeting to which the public is admitted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Folsom, as follows:

- A. The public shall and will be excluded from that portion of a meeting conducted by the Borough Council on Tuesday, October 10, 2017, concerning matters contemplated in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 et seq., and to specifically include contract negotiations under N.J.S.A.10:4-12(b)(7).
- B. Directing the Clerk to separately record the minutes of that portion of the aforesaid meeting dealing with such matters and retain same within a confidential file until such time that those matters have been fully acted upon by the Township Committee.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Folsom is statutorily authorized by N.J.S.A. 40A:65-4 to enter into Shared Services Agreements with the State, County, as well as Local Governments; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Folsom and the New Jersey Department of Transportation have agreed to enter into a Shared Services Agreement concerning the storage and purchase of salt under the "2017-2020 Salt Support Program"; and

WHEREAS, the provision of such services and amenities is in the best interests of the Borough of Folsom residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Folsom, County of Atlantic, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Over the last few months the department participated in various events which kept everyone busy one of which was assisting with the first local National Night Out which proved to be very successful. We completed our building renovations and placed our new used 75ft ladder truck in service. Members participated in the NJ State Firefighters Convention where our Department took first place for the Fire Department Marching Unit. There were also (5) new smoke detectors installed at various residence in Folsom. Once again were in station every Tuesday night and we encourage the public to stop down and check us out. ENGINEER'S REPORT:

FY16 State Aid Project - 14th Street

The contractor for the project, Arawak Paving Inc., completed the resurfacing of 14th Street from the intersection with Mays Landing - Blue Anchor Road to the seam from the resurfacing work completed in 2013, except for the intersection of Backline Road.

All striping work has been completed, including the new markers for the updated railroad crossing. There are still several minor items Arawak needs to complete, including the new curb head pieces and signage.

As the paving work was being completed it became evident that a stormwater crossing near Backline Road had failed. It's likely the heavy equipment used during the resurfacing may have damaged the pipe. We are working with Arawak to determine the best method to replace the crossing with minimal impact to the resurfaced roadway.

FY17 State Aid Project - Discretionary Funding

The Borough received notification last month that the NJDOT would be unable to provide Local Aid Infrastructure Funds for the discretionary funding request for the remaining section of 14th Street.

FY18 State Aid Project

Our office submitted the application to the FY 2018 State Aid Funding for the 2018 Road Program Project, which included the remaining portion of 14th Street, 15th Street from Mays Landing - Blue Anchor Road to Backline Road, and Backline Road from 15th Street to Memory Lane.

We would expect to hear on funding approval in early 2018.

2016 Community Development Block Grant Funding - Borough Hall Automatic Door Operators

The bid plans and specifications are currently available with the bid opening date scheduled for Wednesday, October 18th at 10 AM.

Mayor DeStefano reminded residents that the re-val people are coming around to your homes and you have the option to make an appointment just call Borough Hall.
